




<p>This contemporary home is fashioned in the ranch style. The one-story home has a low-pitched gable roof that extends out on front elevation to create a covered carport. The exterior material is brick in a stretcher bond, which is the same material as the carport. The door is located on the right side of the front facade and is flush with the exterior wall. A large picture window is placed on the left side of the front door and four stacked awning windows are located on the left side of the front door. continued...</p>

<p>This house was built in 1959 by local architect and builder Douglas R Johnson for himself, his wife Shirley R, & their two children (Property Card). Doug continued to build and design houses until 1965 when he became facilities manager for Gilford Instrument Laboratories, which designed spectrophotometers for use in medical diagnostics. Doug also served a number of terms on the Oberlin city council. Shirley was active in the Ohio Civil Liberties Union, and helped to found the Oberlin chapter. continued...</p>

<p>The house is on the north side of W. College St. and is the seventh house from the intersection of W.College and Prospect St. The house is in excellent condition and appears to have only a few alterations. The house is surrounded by other well-maintained homes.</p>

windows are to the right. Several large picture windows are located farther down on the front elevation. Several repeated sets of four stacked awning windows appear on the east elevation. Vinyl siding appears to be located under the roof on the east elevation and west elevations. No windows are present on the west elevation. The carport and foliage obscure several facades. The house is rectangular in plan and according to the Lorain County Auditor's property card; the house contains a full basement. A stone chimney is located off-center within the ridge line.
