

This simple early 20th century house features a full front porch supported by Tuscan columns. The entry is at the far right and has a window in the upper half. A pair of one-over-one windows is at the left side of the first story. The second story has a polygonal bay window at the right with three one-over-one windows and a flat roof. This house was built c. 1904-8 for George W & Marion Kelner (Property Card, City Directory). George was a plumber & farmer; he retired in 1910 (Census, City Directory, Holsworth). A traveling salesman, Clarence J Barbor, lived here with the Kelners c. 1908-16. Between 1927-9, Mary & W.C. Winder, a barber, & at least 3 children moved here (City Directory). The directory also lists 2 OC students, sisters Helen & Minnie Winder, here; their relationship to W.C. is unknown. The sisters were from Mt. continued...

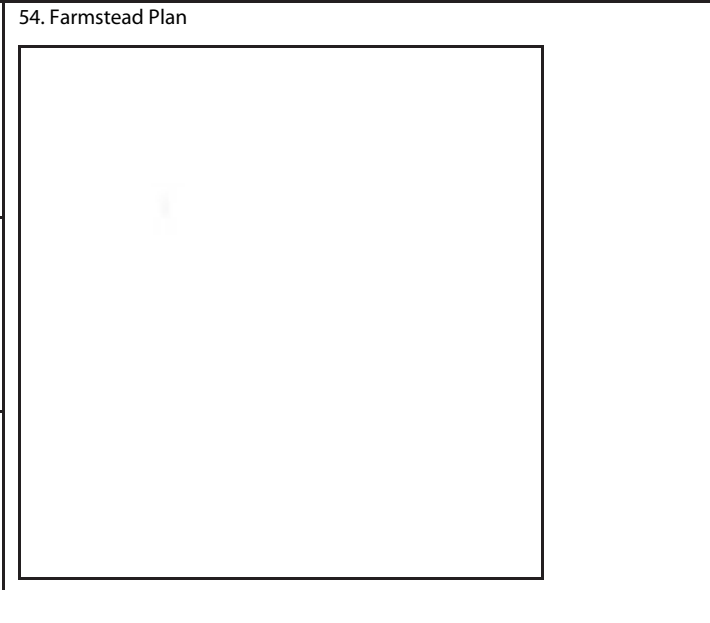

42. Further Description of Important Interior and Exterior Features (Con't)

round wood shingles. The remainder of the exterior is made of square shingles. The west elevation has a door in the addition at the far right, which is shaded by a shed hood. A pair of one-over-one windows is situated to the left of the door. A one-over-one window is between the first and second stories, near the center, and another one-over-one window is at the left and right of the second story. The attic has rounded shingles and a square window. The east elevation features a gabled section near the center that has pairs of one-over-one windows at the first and second stories; the same windows are in the portion to the right. A one-over-one window is also located in the addition at the far left of the elevation. The gable contains a square window in the attic and rounded shingles.

43. History and Significance (Con't)

Victory (Hi-O-Hi). Both worked in education, Helen in math & Minnie in history (Hi-O-Hi, Alumni Register). Miriam & James A Brady, an insurance agent, & 3 children lived here at least from 1933-6 (City Directory). In addition, Louise B, Marjorie R & another James A Brady, resided here in 1933 (City Directory). Louise was a student & Marjorie was a stenographer (City Directory). From 1937-40, Irene & Reuel Bryan Frost, an asst. professor of geology & geography at OC, lived here with their 3 children (City Directory, Alumni Register). By 1942, Carrie & Ralph/Robert W Brown moved in; they lived here through 1944 (City Directory). Between 1944-56, Patricia R & Stanley P Zuris moved in (City Directory). Stanley was an attorney with an office at 9 1/2 S Main. By 1961, Freda A & Emory W Meadows lived here with their sons Philip & Keith (City Directory). Emory died around 1961; Freda was a cook at K-D Bowling Lanes & pie baker at the Oberlin Inn. She lived here until 2002.
